The Bachelor of Fine Arts in History of Art

The BFA in History of Art is a four-year, 120 credit hour degree program combining a 30-hour concentration in the history of art with 30 hours of studio art training to serve students interested in both the history and the making of art.

History of Art B.F.A. majors learn how to investigate and analyze the aesthetic characteristics, meaning, and function of works of art, and to place works in historical, cultural, and stylistic contexts. Students gain a general knowledge of the monuments and principal artists of all major periods of the past, with an emphasis on the art of the 20th- and 21stcenturies and gain a sophisticated understanding of what can be learned about different cultures and time periods through the study of art.

First-Year Preparation

The first year foundations courses for the B.F.A., B.A., and B.A.E. degree include 10 hours of foundations studio, 6 hours of English, and 6 hours of Art History coursework.

Bachelor of Fine Arts in History of Art Degree Requirements

A major in the history of art is available to candidates for the B.F.A. degree. This major combines a 30-hour concentration in art history with 18 hours of studio training (beyond the 34 hours of foundation courses). A total of 120 hours is required for the degree, including 45 junior/senior hours (courses numbered 300 or higher). 30 of these 45 junior/senior hours must be taken in residence at the University of Kansas. ¹ Visual Art majors are required to enroll in 15 credit hours across studio areas. Students select 5 courses from the following 7 listed options: ART 120 Fundamentals of Painting; ART 121 Fundamentals of Printmaking; ART 122 Fundamentals of Sculpture; ART 123 Fundamentals of Expanded Media; ART 131 Fundamentals of Ceramics; ART 132 Fundamentals of Metalsmithing/Jewelry; ART 133 Fundamentals of Fibers. The Fundamental (100 level) courses can be taken concurrently with other 200+ level courses in any studio area. 2

- ³ Credit hour requirements for the degree include 45 credit hours of 300 level or above (300+). These credit hours are typically met through Core 34, major area of study, and/or general elective credit hours. Individual degree mapping is done in partnership with your advisor.
- ⁴ ART 650 and ART 660 should be taken in sequence, during the last two semesters for the degree.

Please note:

All students in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences are required to completed 120 total hours of which 45 hours must be at the Jr/Sr (300+) level.

*Courses with a * designate courses that are degree requirements but can also be taken to fulfill the KU Core 34 requirement. If another course if used to fulfill the Core 34 requirement, the course listed is still required as a degree requirement.

Notes:

* - This course is a <u>Required</u> major course and is also part of Core 34: Systemwide General Education. If this course is not taken to fulfill the Core 34:SGE requirement, it must be taken in place of elective hours.

** - This course is a <u>Recommended</u> Core 34: Systemwide General Education course. This specific course is not required but is recommended by the program's faculty.

*** - This course is a <u>Required</u> Core 34: Systemwide General Education course. This program is approved by the Kansas Board of Regents to require this specific Core 34:Systemwide General Education course. If a student did not take this course it must be taken in addition to other degree requirements.
