In Fall 2024, KU Core 34 was implemented to align with the Kansas Board of Regent's statewide general education (SGE) framework. The KU Core 34 is the university-wide general education curriculum all incoming students complete. By completing the KU Core 34, the successful graduate will:

- Acquire essential skills for academic, professional, and academic growth
- Build a broad background of knowledge within arts and humanities, social sciences, and the natural and physical sciences
- Gain an appreciation for U.S. and global cultures
- Cultivate ethical integrity and personal responsibility
